1. Genesis & Objectives

GENESIS

KAMALNISHTHA SANSTHAN is a community based organization in the voluntary sector, working directly with poor and marginalized. We are registered under Rajasthan Societies Registration Act of 1958, 80 FCRA and Disable Persons Act 52 92) of 1995. KN is also exempted under section 12A and 80G-5(F) of Indian Income Tax Act. Our strategic focus is to create enabling environment in which people have access to opportunities – to maximize their potential, to participate actively in the development process and shape the present and future of their communities and country.

The Institute strives for excellence in Education and Rural Technology; New Advances in Vocational Applications; Legal Matters concerning Intellectual Property, environmental & agricultural betterment, consumer protection, civil rights, social evil eradication, disable persons welfare activities, RCH activities, SHG training, research & development, de-addiction, employment oriented activities, bio control laboratory, Senior citizen's house, drinking water purity, small scale industries promotion etc; and Information, including technology source, consultancy, institutions, collaborations, case studies, etc.

2. Registration ,Recognition and Approval

2.1 Registration

The Sansthan was registered as a non-profit society under the Rajasthan Societies Registration Act of 1958 and Certificate of Registration was obtained on 28th February, 1997.

The Certificate of Registration issued by the Registrar of Societies, Assistant Registrar office, Jhunjhunu bears the number: Jhu/156/1997-98.

2.3 Approval Under Income Tax Act

The Sansthan had approached the Department of Income tax, Ministry of Finance to obtain approval under Section 80(G), 12 (A) of Income Tax Act so that all financial contributions to Institute are eligible for Tax exemption under the Income Tax Act. The Department of Income Tax had issued the approval for the period 20th December, 2002 to 31st March, 2007 and thereafter the approval had been extended up to 31st March 2010. This approval was further extended through communication F.No. आ.आ.-III/जय/80जी/2007.08/1836 dated 29 November, 2007 and the approval was valid up to 31-3-2010.

2.4 F C R A

The Sansthan had been granted recognition by the Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI, under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act from 13th October 2004 with FCRA registration no. 12562008/13-10-2004.

2.4 Disability Act

The Kamalnishtha Sansthan was also registered as a Disable Persons welfare society under the Disable Persons Act 1995-52 (2) by Department of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur and Certificate of Registration was obtained on 15th June, 2009.

The Certificate of Registration issued by the Commissioner (Disability) Rajasthan, Jaipur bears the number: 253/Jaipur/2009-2010.

3. Departments

3.1 KAMALNISHTHA VIDYA NIKETAN (+2)

Our basic motto is that every child is in school and learning well. In this sake of well being Kamalnishtha Vidya Niketan has been established on March 21, 1997 as a primary school in the midst of village Kolsia. Afterwards in 1998 it was promoted into middle school and since 2003 it has been imparting its services as secondary school. The Sansthan has been providing formal and regular education on headquarter of the institute from beginning time

This institute possesses an outstanding image in the field of education. This year 600 hundred students are availing and persuading for a better education. Besides basic education personality development and career planning is remarkable feature at here. Free education is provided to handicapped and poor castaway students. This very year in 2008 it has promoted as senior secondary school with Arts, Science, Home Science, Agriculture and Fine Arts faculty.

The Kamalnishtha Sansthan, Kolsia has been providing formal and regular education on headquarter of the institute from beginning time. There is a facility of quality technical education in this school, keeping in view the need of modern area. Computer laboratory is established for awareness and update information to give to students of rural area. The school provides computer education free cost to her students. Keeping in mind the need of the students of this area, Drawing, home-Science & Agriculture Science are taught in Senior Secondary with other subjects of Science & Arts.

Quite a good number (7105) of books have been procured from different sources and the village children with great interest are using the library. Late. Dr. Sahib Singh Ji Verma, Former Union Labor Minister visited the Sansthan on 20th May, 2003 and contributed so many books, racks, library furniture for this library. 3.5 Community Radio Station (FM)

We embrace diversity, tolerance of others' opinions and freedom of expression. KAMALVANI celebrates and promotes the creative, cultural and educational vitality of the local community.

KAMALVANI is committed to the values expressed by her mission, especially as they relate to issues involving the various ethnic groups living in our community, women, the economically disadvantaged or challenged, and other groups who may be disenfranchised in our society. We offer safe haven for expression by members of these groups, regardless of their social status, race, gender, or sexual orientation, and by our activities hope to promote peace, goodwill and a sense of community beyond the walls of this radio station.

THEMATIC FOCUS

Family welfare system, Child and maternal health, Social Evils, Cultural Values, Traditional customs of the society and its welfare aspect, Tobacco free Schools, Paintings and Folk Culture of Shekhawati area.

COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

The community is involved in conducting interview and studio talks. Folk artists from the community make presentations over the radio frequently. Besides, the radio involves the community in the presentations, conducting quiz programmes and other cultural and educational competition over radio.

3.6 Smt. Rama Devi Women College, Kolsiya



Giving strength to the work of the institution, Mrs. Rama Devi, the wife of freedom fighter Chaudhary Begaram, who was a fighter of Azad Hind Fauj in India's freedom struggle, established Mrs. Rama Devi Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Kolsia on August 01, 2017. This is the first and only women's college of village Kolsia.

After the departure to heaven of Shri Begaram ji in 2006, this college was established with the amount of pension received in 10 years to develop the higher education of

the women of the local and surrounding areas.

Arrangements have been made for the study of 120 graduate level girl students in the Faculty of Science and Arts in the college. The facility of scholarship and freeship has also been made for poor-disabled girl students. The affiliation of the college is from Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Shekhawati Vishwavidyalaya, Katrathal, Sikar.

3.7 Kolsiya Tie & Dye Cluster (SFURTI)



Shekhawati region has been famous for handicrafts and handicrafts since ancient times.

Bundi-Bandhej has been a famous master work of this area. The three districts of Shekhawati are estimated to have more than five lakh handicraft and handicraft artisans, most of who belong to the Bundi-Bandhej region.

In this survey, it was found that the income of women doing Bundi-Bandhej work in Kolsiya and its surrounding areas is only between Rs 400 and 1700 per month, which can be increased with little effort.

Approval has been given for 349 women artisans under the SFURTI scheme of the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, New Delhi, Government of India. These women are residents of Kolasiya, Bai, Birol, Parasrampura, Jakhal, Kari, Bhagera, Barwasi villages. Kamalnishtha Sansthan has provided free land and 10% share for this center to be built at a cost of Rs.03 crore.

Even today Shekhawati region is famous for its fresco paintings in the world. Kamalnishtha Sansthan thinks that through this cluster, efforts will be made to

decorate everybody by engraving the world's famous Shekhawati Havelis for fresco painting on clothes through Bundi-Bandhej. Vivekananda Global University, Jaipur is guiding the Kolsiya Tie & Die Cluster to function well.

4. Activities

4.1 Educational Activities

❖ Formal Education





The Kamalnishtha Sansthan, Kolsia has been providing formal and regular education on the headquarter of the institute from beginning time. There is a facility of quality technical education in this school, keeping in view the need of modern area. Computer laboratory is established for awareness and update information to give to students of rural area. The school provides computer education free cost to her students. Keeping in mind the need of the students of this area, Science, Arts, Drawing, home-Science & Agriculture Science.



❖ Computer Literacy Programme

Need of today's academic world Kamalnishtha Sansthan also run computer literacy programme in Jhunjhunu and Jaipur districts of Rajasthan. Sansthan every equipped with computers. Computer education is being dealt with through the Certificate in Computer Education (CCA) of the National Institute of Open Schooling, MHRD, GOI, New Delhi. This year 552 students consulted the program and being literate about basic computing.

❖ Guidance and Counseling Programme

The Kamalnishtha Sansthan has started a facility of vocational and educational guidance and counseling to the students of this area. There is a tough job for rural students to choose for further studies. A learned and competent counselor has been appointed at the teacher providing guidance and counseling to the students. Its' major objectives are –

-  *to select the area of the studies,*
-  *to select the institution for further studies,*
-  *to manage the finance for education,*
-  *to prepare the students for admission in high quality vocational education,*

-  to give information about vocational training institutions, and
-  to help the students in appointment of various vocational institutions.

About 450 students are benefited in this financial year.

❖ Self Help Groups (SHGs)

We believe that if the poor people of the rural areas are given opportunities, they would not only demonstrate their capability of shouldering the responsibility of their own development, but they could also create a situation wherein they could themselves explore opportunities for furthering the development process. It is with this firm belief that we create awareness among the poor, small and marginal farmers in the villages and help them in work planning as well as in raising financial resources.

Based on the objectives mentioned above we started working in this year particularly in the direction of organizing the poorer section and development of natural resources, and also for developing an appropriate credit system as a result of which the concept of Self-Help Groups Programme. During the process, besides our own experiences, we also tried to learn them from the similar efforts being made in other parts of the country.

The Sansthan has conduct regular meeting and training were conducted for creating a proper understanding among the groups and to enhance their management capabilities and has helped in giving the desired results. Three such groups are working properly and linkup with SBI, Nawalgarh.

❖ Rural Children Library

With a view to develop interest in reading among the children, a small library with children's books was established and Prof.N.K.Ambasht, Chairman, National Institute of Open Schooling, New Delhi, inaugurated it. Quite a good number of books have been procured from different sources and the village children with great interest are using the library. Presently it contains more than 7500 books and 15 regular magazines are coming to library.

❖ Rural Talent Search Program

Like every year Kamalnishtha Sansthan organized different activities were with a view to encourage the talents among the rural children, such as competitions in essay-writing, debate, painting, singing and other cultural and educational activities. The best

amongst the competitors were appropriate rewarded on the occasion of the foundation day of the organisation.

❖ Scout & Guide Activity

As co-curricular activity Kamalnishtha Sansthan join her hand with the Bharat Scout & Guide activity through the schools, which are managed by him. During the year more than 10 teachers and 150 students (both boys & girls) were attended different level scout & guide program and get good achievements.

❖ Book Fair & Book Promotion

Like every year Kamalnishtha Sansthan organized book fair and book promotion activities with a view to encourage the reading habits among the rural children. VO has been conducted different such as competitions in essay-writing, debate, painting, singing and other cultural and educational activities to promote the books.

❖ Research and Development

With a view to achieve the objective of the organization, Kamalnishtha Sansthan has developed three-tier system of Education, Research and Extension. During the year, Sansthan has carried out research activities in various spheres with its own resources. Important and notable activities carried out during the year are detailed below -

4.2 SOCIAL WELFARE ACTIVITIES

❖ De-addiction Programme

Village level camps were organised to educate the villagers about ill effects of the various modes of addiction through deliberative efforts. One time supply of the medicines prescribed for individual addicts was also provided cost free. More than 50 addicts benefited from these camps.

❖ Social Evils Eradication

Many evil social practices adversely affecting the socio-economic conditions of the villagers prevail in the region, such as dowry system, Nukta indebtedness, child marriage, death feast etc. which leave a direct social and economic impact on the sufferer. IEC methods were adopted to educate the people in this direction.

❖ Employment-oriented Activities

This is a institution's permanent programme, which is continued with own meager

resources and without any financial support from outside, the organisation had undertaken some employment-oriented activities during the year to encourage self-employment attitude among the villagers, which included tailoring, typing, computer basic, carpet weaving. Total 520 women/men benefited from the program and being able to do own job as household work.

❖ Consumer awareness program

From time to time meetings and deliberations were held to apprise the general public about the various legal provisions to protect them from exploitation in the market. Similarly, they were apprised of the various welfare activities available to them through the different government agencies by way of display of posters and other literature by different departments.

❖ Water Cleaning and Water Purity

Through public meetings, speeches, demonstrations etc. efforts were made to educate the villagers about the importance of the water cleanliness and purity and the steps to be taken locally to gain the same.

4.3 CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

❖ Rural Sports and Games

Like every year, sports and games meet was organised for the rural youths from the surrounding villages in which about 140 youths participated. The main items of interest for the rural youths were Kabbaddi, Volleyball, different races and jumps. Suitable prizes were distributed.

4.4 Agricultural Activities

In Rajasthan economy still target depends on agriculture and the economic upliftment of the area is impossible without the development of agriculture which can be made possible by extending the information of the research work and new techniques of farming, storing and marketing. The Sansthan has rendered her services in the following areas –

❖ **Water Management & Soil Conservation**

During the year KN emphasis was on water management and soil conservation besides new agricultural techniques for which help was taken from the experts from Krishi Vigyan Kendras and other agricultural institutions. More than 350 farmers actively participated and benefited from these efforts of the organisation.

❖ **Organic Farming and Vermi Compost**

During the year Sansthan has organised the practical demonstrations with the help of agricultural experts to enable the farmers familiar with Organic farming and Vermi Compost.

❖ **Medicinal Plants Farming**

State Rajasthan produces a large number of varieties of medicinal plants. A survey was conducted to identify the plants and the relevant information's about the prices, storing process and marketing were gathered from various departments concerned and the information, thus collected, was extended to the farmers and unemployed youth.

4.5 Water Harvesting Activities






The desert areas in the Jhunjhunu district in Rajasthan have been very badly affected by the situation of serious drought and famine in every alternative year. People have faced a series of famine in the period from 1998 to 2002 continually and after that also alternatively in the block of Nawalgarh and Udaipurwati. Varieties of opposite effects are laid on people of villages in the situation of famine as their main sources of livelihood are agriculture and animal farming and leave of these both resources are dependent upon rain. FAMINE means state of no rain. In between employment for rural community, drinking water/Animal caring etc. are the main problems.

The project areas taken up by the organisation is the villages of Nawalgarh and Udaipurwati Panchayat Samiti of Jhunjhunu district.

CAPART, Jaipur had sanctioned Roof Top Water Harvesting Tanka Project to Kamalnishtha Sansthan. Soon after sanction of the project, Kamalnishtha Sansthan started mobilization of beneficiaries. Though list of 100 families communicated to CAPART had given their acceptance after process of awareness generation. This VO

has been making follow up programmes.

The main objectives of this project are –

-  *To introduce and popularize the technology of roof top water harvesting among the people in general and poor people in particular.*
-  *To help the poor and needy people to install roof top water harvesting system in their houses.*
-  *To ensure reduction of use of ground water through bore wells to maintain the water table in the area.*
-  *To arrange meeting and cultural programmes explaining the technology of roof top water harvesting.*
-  *To train women from self help groups to motivate the people about the importance of roof top water harvesting scheme.*

4.6 Services of Handicapped persons

The Kamalnishtha Sansthan is engaged to serve handicapped (disabled) persons from starting of the institute to fulfill the objectives. The institute is extending her helping hands to the persons who are physically and mentally disabled persons. The following activities are being conducting by the institute in this area.

Disable Persons Vocational Training Programme

With the helping hand of SSCBR ITI the VO has been run Disable Persons Vocational Training Programme during the year. Soon after this activity, Kamalnishtha Sansthan started mobilization of beneficiaries. Though list of 300 disable men-women members communicated their acceptance after process of awareness generation.

Dignitaries of the area and experts of the field visited training sites and given the blessing to group men-women for successfully running the activities after completion of training programme.

Free of cost Education

The Institute provided free of cost education to Institute the disabled students who are studying in the sister concerned schools. Now, twenty students are benefiting in this year (sessions).

Medical facility

Various types of medical facilities are being provided to the people of this rural area. Such as periodical medical check-up, vaccination, magic show, rural dramas, free supply of children's books, etc.

4.7 Others Activities

❖ Children's Welfare Programme

This year also different activities for the welfare of village children were undertaken during the period, such as periodical medical check-up, vaccination, magic shows, rural dramas, free supply of children's books, etc.

❖ Health and Family Welfare

This Sansthan is actively coordinated in the conduct of the various government programmes in the field of public health and family welfare to ensure maximum and meaningful participation of the villages. In this regard the Sansthan engaged in mother and child health awareness

4.8 Bio Gas

Good health is very important to live long, everybody accepts this truth but how? Nobody is thinking about this. Today's ground reality is that, if something is easily available, taste and look good then it is accepted, whatever may be the cost. Nobody is realizing, what is going inside the body and how it will affect the health? In this direction KVIC has taken the initiative to put up biogas reactors and started a 10-day training programme "Construction cum Maintenance Course" at Freedom Fighter Choudhary Begaram ITI, Kolsiya to provide skilled persons at large to construct these reactors. 50 youth were provided with this training course in 5 batches, who will be Khadi and Village Industries Commission's rural engineering technicians (RET). Two biogas reactors were constructed for each batch to provide practical knowledge.

4.9 Professional Training Associate

Kamalnishtha Sansthan's subsidiary organization Freedom Fighter Choudhary Begaram ITI got the status of "Professional Training associate" and it is providing training on following courses to develop a technical skill set in unemployed youth of rural poor areas of Rajasthan to create employment opportunity among them.
